- A student who needs financial assistance is urged to contact the College as early as possible. A student's financial package may be certified up to the cost of attendance at Midwest Barber College and once disbursed, federal funding is applied to the student's account.

- A financial aid administrator is available during the designated hours of operation to assist any prospective students in determining their financial need.
- Student financial aid at Midwest Barber College is calculated at full-time status, which is defined as completing a minimum of 900 clock hours. If students attend less than full-time status, their financial assistance may be recalculated.

S3 PROGRAM (SECONDARY STUDENT SCREENING)

It is the goal of Midwest Barber College to have a completion rate (the number of students finishing the program) in excess of 90%. By doing so, the number of students interrupting their program goal and incurring debt without a skill to assist them in paying their tuition should be minimal. The College is only interested in enrolling those students who are interested in entering the barbering profession.

Therefore, the College has implemented a secondary screening opportunity for all new incoming students as follows:

- Newly enrolled students spend time in the classroom discovering barbering. Classes include: Study Skills, History of Barbering, Professional Image Microbiology Infection Control & Safe Work Habits Implements, Tools & Equipment.
- At the conclusion of the first two-week period, following a thorough review and evaluation by the instructor a conference will be arranged at which time each student will be given one of the following assessments:
 - a. Affirmative Progress thus far is very good and the student is likely to complete the barber program and be successful in the profession if this level of commitment is maintained. Perhaps – progress thus far is marginally at the level required for completion of the barber program. Greater, consistent effort is required. However, a final determination will be made at the end of the third week.
 - b. **Perhaps** Progress thus far is marginally at the level required for completion of the barber program. Greater, consistent effort is required. However, the final determination will be made at the end of the third week.
 - c. **Rejected** Progress thus far is not acceptable, continued effort at this level will likely not allow the student to complete the program in a timely manner or be successful in the barbering profession.

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

Bacteriology, Sterilization, Sanitation and Decontamination: Knowledge and use of measures to promote and protect good health against any harmful germs.

Chemistry: Basic understanding of the chemicals used in our profession.

Disorders and Diseases of the Skin, Scalp, Hair and Nails: Recognition through examination and treatment of these conditions as necessary.

Electricity and Light: The benefits, effects and safety factors of electricity as applied to any barber service.

Facial Treatments: The process used to enhance the beauty and health of the face.

First Aid: The basics of first aid and how it is applied in our industry.

Hair Bleaching: Partial or total removal of pigmented color from the hair with the use of chemicals.

Hair Coloring: The science and art of changing hair color through the use of chemicals.

Hair Cutting and Shaping: This is the foundation of all hair styling and is performed with styling shears, razors and/or clippers.

Hair: One of the most important aspects of our profession! This course is in regards to the individual's appearance and its relation to the styling and continued healthy growth that we can promote.

Hairstyling: The ability to create, using the individual's hair, a frame for the head and face that compliments their complete look.

Hygiene and Good Grooming: Hygiene concerns both the public and the individual, including healthful living habits. Good grooming refers to the student regarding the individual's appearance.

Permanent Waving: Care and knowledge of curling hair permanently through the use of chemicals.

Professional Ethics: Deals with the proper conduct of the student in relations to the employer, clients and co-workers.

Scalp and Hair Treatments: Preserving the health and beauty of the scalp and hair.

Shop Management: Key factors used for the successful management and ownership of a shop, such as day-to-day operation, growth and future opportunities, as well as the background studies needed to achieve these goals.

Skin and Scalp: The study of these areas of the head and their structure to treat them effectively, give advice and further enhance their beauty with future treatments to keep them healthy.

State Laws: Understanding of the laws relating to barbers in the State of Kansas.

Visual Poise: Refers to the growing of one's self into an ideal pattern that is beneficial to themselves as well as society.
